Nobody builds a boat like Boston Whaler.

And nobody goes to such extremes to prove their point. The fact is, a Boston Whaler absolutely, positively will not sink. Period.

The reason for such phenomenal buoyancy lies in the way we construct every Boston Whaler hull. It's a process totally unlike any other.



First, we mold an inner and outer skin of fiberglass. Then, before these have a chance to cure completely, we join them together and inject foam into the cavity between. The foam expands rapidly to fill the entire structure from gunnel to gunnel, then bonds with the uncured fiberglass to form a solid, one-piece hull. This rapid expansion creates an incredibly tight-celled material, impervious to water, and able to provide two and one-half times the floatation required to meet U.S. Coast Guard specifications.

The one-piece structure that results also adds unbelievable strength and rigidity to every Boston Whaler. A feature you're sure to appreciate when dodging big offshore rollers or cross-

ing angry harbor bars.

Boston Whaler construction is something you'll appreciate if and when you decide to sell your boat, too. Because we build our boats to withstand the forces of the marketplace just as effectively as they resist the forces of nature. In other words, Boston Whalers hold their value. And that's reason enough to pay a little bit more for one.







Although we've inspired many imitators, the Boston Whaler hull remains as unique on the outside as it is on the inside. That's because safety is our first and foremost consideration whenever we set out to design a new boat. Whether that means keeping kids safe while they're zipping around the harbor, or keeping fishermen secure when they head offshore.



Twin sponsons accomplish the former assignment admirably. Found on smaller Whalers, they act to keep our boats incredibly stable, even when confronted by a throng of thirteen-year-olds. They also provide unmatched load-carrying capacity. Which means you can pack one of our smaller boats chock full of fishing gear, groceries, diving equipment—you name it—and not have to worry about taking an unexpected swim.

As Whalers get larger, however, their hulls become perfectly suited for the most vigorous offshore work you'll ever ask a boat to do. Sharper bow angles tear cleanly through the water, while curved chines flick spray out, back and away from you and your passengers. Wider beams give you the sure-footed stability you need. And deep-Vees, with up to an 18-degree deadrise, make for a fast, comfortable trip.

The 22,25 and 27 each boast a forward V-berth large enough to sleep two adults; spacious enough to stow all your gear out of the way. There's privacy for a head, and security for your equipment when you're away from the boat. Solid teak companionway doors open on these interiors, and liftable forward Lexan hatches provide ample light and ventilation.

Of course, all this is not to say our Cuddies sacrifice one bit in the way of Outrage performance. Center-console battlestations maximize your fish-fighting room. Powerful deep-Vee hulls slice up the sea. And unsinkable Boston Whaler construction means you can feel safe wherever you go.





hen boats go by the not-somodest name of Revenge, you'd expect them to be solid, powerful and worthy of the most rugged offshore environs.

What you can also expect are interiors that offer shelter when it gets rough outside and privacy when it gets dark. Handsome teak joinery accents the seven-foot V-berths, while double Lexan hatches and ports afford plenty of light and ventilation.

On deck, the Revenge 22 and Revenge 25 are just as accommodating. Each features a walk-through windshield that opens onto an extended, full-length bow pulpit. Which lets you get fore and aft just as easily as the fish. And each offers cushioned swivel seats, under-gunnel rod racks, an aft fishwell, baitwell and more.

If you're considering a sportfishing boat, these two wide beam Whalers should help narrow down your options. Compare them with anything else in their class and you'll see what we mean.

Few sportsfishermen in the 25- to 30-foot range offer this much fighting room, for example. On the run, few track as smoothly. And none handle rough weather with such unsinkable confidence. As if that wasn't enough, the 25 and 27 offer easy walkaround access to the bow when your fish decides to go forward.

Belowdecks, the 25 and 27 keep on shining. With cabins that include full galleys, dinettes and private head compartments, you'll be tempted to turn every fishing trip into an overnight success.







or a company that started out building small boats, we've taken some pretty big strides in our history. But none so big as the Whaler 27 Full Cabin and the Whaler 31.

Both are foam cored, deep-Vee'd and wide of beam. Which means the 27 Full Cabin and Whaler 31 are not only unsinkable, but tough enough to take you just about anywhere.

A 245-gallon fuel tank helps the 31 log many offshore miles. While its mighty 125-square-foot cockpit lets you deal just as efficiently with anything that swims.

Down below, each comes complete with running water, a private head compartment and a full galley. The 31 has a forward stateroom as well as a fold-down dinette, so it sleeps four comfortably, while the 27 Full Cabin easily accommodates two.


