


#### When you've found the right boat, nothing else matters.

People expect a lot from a Boston Whaler\* perhaps more than they would from any other boat.

Admittedly, that's a tough challenge to meet year after year. But we meet it because it is vital to the one thing that is most important to us—the people who use our boats.

This year, there is a sense of energy and vitality running throughout our company like never before. A vitality instilled by individuals who share the same passion for being on the water that you do.

'This passion is evident in what we're introducing this year. Boats with smarter fishing features. New efficient hull shapes. Boats re-engineered to make them more affordable without compromising what makes them a Whaler? Even a whole new concept in boating, a peppy jet boat called the Rage™ that will change how people have fun on the water.

But as much as our new boats look different, they are built in the same tough, durable way as a 13 Sport that's been pulling tender duty for the past 30 years. They are built like no other boat in the world.

And that is the most compelling reason of all to consider a Boston Whaler. The unsinkable legend.

### HOW WE DESIGN THE RIGHT BOAT.

There are a lot of new boats coming out of Boston Whaler these days — the Rage, the 16SL, the 21 Walkaround, and others. But whether it be one of our new boats, a nine-foot tender or a 27 Offshore, we approach the design of each boat with the same question in

mind — how will the boat be used? Then, using the latest in CAD/CAM technology, we arrive at a layout rich in features and ideally suited for the many tasks the boat will be asked to perform.

The result is a prep station with cutting boards, knife slots, shower head, wash-down hose and livewell all placed within

easy reach. Tender seats that can handle hundreds of pounds in static loads. Railings securely anchored and coamings scaled to catch a person above the knees. A large unobstructed fishing area, yet also lots of storage and seating.



Unique sponsons give our smaller boats a dry, stable, unsinkable ride.



As our hulls get larger, the shape evolves. Smaller sponsons lend to stability, while a deeper V-shape gives a smoother ride.



Larger bulls have a wider beam, so there's less need for sponsons, and a much deeper V-shape that's ideal for open water.

Since safety is our foremost concern, part of the design decision entails hull shapes that are as unique to Boston Whaler as our interiors.



You'll notice a new deeper-Vee hull and higher freeboard on some of our newer boats. And you'll appreciate the increased fuel efficiency.

Twin sponsons give our smaller boats incredible stability and load-carrying capacity. Which is why, if you look on any harbor or bay, you'll see more Whalers loaded



Our new bulls look different on the outside. But inside, they're the same Unibond™ construction as every other Boston Whaler. Positively durable, absolutely unsinkable.

with groceries and gear in tender duty.

Being used as a fishing platform for a gang
of thirteen-year-olds. Or corralling a group
of novice sailors.

Head out to deeper water, however, and you'll see Whalers with a different shape. A shape ideally suited for the most grueling offshore work. Sharper bow entries cut cleanly through the water, while numerous chines direct spray out, back and away from you and your passengers. Wider beams ensure sure-footed stability. And deep-Vees, with up to a 20-degree deadrise, make for a fast, comfortable trip.

Regardless of which size Whaler you're thinking of, you can be sure of one thing. From the beginning, it was designed to be the right boat.

### HOW WE MAKE THE RIGHT BOAT.

Of course, innovation in design doesn't do much good if it doesn't transcend to the manufacturing process. Which is why we employ techniques novel to our industry.

In fact, the most novel is one that we've

been employing for over 34 years, but has yet to be duplicated by any other company - though many have tried. We're referring to our Unibond construction. A construction process that results in a boat that absolutely, positively will not sink. No matter what. To begin with, we mold an inner and outer skin of fiberglass instead of the usual single outer skin. Before the skins have a chance to cure completely, we join them together and inject a compound into the cavity that catalyzes to form lightweight yet highdensity closed-cell foam. Under intense pressure, the foam expands rapidly to fill the entire structure from gunnel to gunnel, then chemically bonds with the uncured fiberglass to form a solid, one-piece hull.

Out of this process comes a hull with incredible strength and the greatest flotation — over 2½ times that required to meet U.S. Coast Guard specifications.

The Competition

We pulled the plug on a 17' Whaler, overloaded it with 10 people and it still floated high enough to keep the powerhead of the engine above water. Then, we pulled the plug on a competitor's 17' boat. It lacks the buoyancy and stability to support even five people.

Some boat companies do add foam to their hulls. But the foam doesn't chemically bond as it does in our Unibond construction. This traditional method of putting in Traditional Boston Whaler Unibond Construction Construction



Look under the deck of most other boats and you see the traditional construction method, which uses stringers and foam blocks. Look under our deck and you see one solid double hull. That's the way it comes out of the mold.

foam blocks adds some flotation and weight, but no strength.

To compensate, they attempt to add strength through wood stringers and secondary

bonding. And they have to rely on the decks for rigidity and support.

In fact, we're so confident in our hulls that we are the only company that, for over 34 years, has been offering a ten-year limited transferable hull warranty. So if you should ever decide to sell your Whaler within that time, you can do so knowing the boat will still be protected. It is because of the confidence we have in our boats that you will find Boston Whalers being asked to perform more governmental and commercial tasks than just about any other boat. Our

same basic design we use in our recreational hulls and then outfits them for the jobs they're meant to do.

Take a walk around the inside of a Boston

Whaler and you'll see that like our hulls, we
go beyond what is necessary. The moldedin non-skid really works when it's wet.

Deck and cockpit seams are virtually nonexistent. All bow rails are non-corrosive 316
stainless steel.


We use heat-shrink butt wire connectors so water stays out. Wires are tin to ward off

Here's an example of how we take quality to the extreme. We finish the inside as well as the outside—even in places you don't ordinarily see. Look at this batch—you won't find that on most other boats.

the hardware won't vibrate off. The fasteners are made with passivated stainless steel that resists rust. And hardware is anchored to aluminum backing plates.

(Other companies use wood blocks, which like wood stringers, will eventually rot out.



We anchor every single load-bearing fitting to a aluminum backing plate. Other companies use wood, which can rot from water that seeps down the screw boles.

But chances are, you won't find that out until it's too late.)

As you can see, at Boston Whaler we make our boats right from the start.

### HOW WE REFINE THE RIGHT BOAT.

While every Whaler made today is the absolute best Whaler it can be, that's not good enough. We want to make it even better.



Using state-of-the-art strain sensors, we pin-point high stress areas to build a stronger, more fuel-efficient bull. Most companies just keep laying on glass helterskelter, which is just laying on more weight and cost.

Technologies, processes and materials are constantly changing. So we must constantly examine and refine our entire process, from design to manufacturing, to ensure that we are utilizing the most innovative techniques and resources available today.

However, this doesn't mean making changes for the sake of change — it means making the right changes.

For example, the basic way that we make

each boat — injecting foam into a mold — has not changed in over 30 years because there is no better way to make a boat.

Nor is there a better instrument for inspecting hulls than the instrument we've used for the last three decades — the human ear.

With a piano tuner's patience, we tap every single square inch of every single hull, listening for that rare dull thud that gives away a void in the cured foam.


But elements within each process have changed. New laminates provide higher strength at a lower weight, thereby increasing hull strength while improving fuel efficiency. Computers calculate the exact volume of foam, and soon, will be used

to ensure a more uniform mixing process.

The list goes on and on, to the point where no other boat company can match Boston







As we test and refine resins, we use micrograph technology so we can actually see how well they bond to the fiberglass. Do other companies do this? Sure, in the aerospace industry, but not in the boating industry.

Which is, after all, what makes it the right boat for you.




Necessity forced Will Case to choose a 17'



Montauk as Nauset Marine's workboat. "No other boat could do what I ask that boat to do," he says. Going on 13 years now, people around Pleasant Bay on Cape Cod bave watched Will and the modified Montauk be moved the console a bit to starboard and added a davit - do everything from pull moorings (12-15 a trip, some weighing up to 200 lbs.) and tow 40' boats, to lug 1,500 pounds of gear and even break ice. 





When people want the absolute best boat





When did they decide on Guardians? Right after they fired a thousand rounds into one and saw that it was still floating.
